900 Highways and Land Matters

- 900.1 Walby Garth Entrance The work has been completed
- **900.2** Langwathby Phone Box Conversion to Information Kiosk

 Project is on going with a grant being applied for and local sponsorship being sought.
- **900.3** Edenhall Playground Repairs As reported at the September meeting, a Cumbria County Council '0 19' grant of £1920 had been successfully applied for to cover the renovation of the Edenhall Playground. This left a balance of £480 to fund in order to cover the full cost of £2400. The Clerk was delighted to report that this sum had been covered in full by local business sponsorship. Councilors expressed their grateful thanks and appreciation for this generosity and very genuine community spirit.
- 900.4 Langwathby Village Hall Parking Access In hand with the owner and developer.
- **900.5** Cemetery Seat The provision of a seat in the Cemetery was in -hand.
- 900.6 Blocked Drains Nobles Garage to Langwathby Bridge. In hand with Highways.

- 900.7 Blocked Drains By Langwathby Stores and Bus Shelter In – hand with Highways.
- 900.8 Overtaking Danger Langwathby Bridge to Toll Bar Junction. –
 Reported that the criteria for the installation of continuous white lines was based on the degree of visibility. In this instance the level of visibility did not warrant their installation and the Parish Council's request was respectfully refused by Cumbria County Councils Highways Department.
- 900.9 Sheep Pens behind Langwathby School –
 Reported that the old dip had been filled in and remedial repair work undertaken. Councilors expressed their grateful thanks to those responsible for this area for the work undertaken.
- 900.10 Grass Cutting Grant Edenhall Langwathby Sports Field
 Reported that the Sports Field Committee had been written to inviting them to submit a grant application in April, for consideration by the Council at the May meeting, to offset some of the Sports Field's upkeep costs.
- 900.11 High Mill / Robin Hood Lane Foul Drain Continuing to monitor.
- 900.12 Coxen Lane, Langwathby Overgrown Growth Corresponded with adjoining property owner.
- 900.13 Langwathby Churchyard Overhanging branches Work completed by Eden District Council
- 900.14 Development Land Adjoining 'Meadow Side' Very Overgrown Site has since been mowed.
- 900.15 Persistent Van Parking in Langwathby Village Green Layby Issue appears resolved but will continue to be monitored
- 900.16 Tractors Parking on the Village Green Opposite the Shop Issue has been mentioned in the Memo.

Action: - Agreed to place temporary sign on the green to deter parking.

- **900.17 Empty Property 11 Salkeld Road Langwathby -** Matter is still ongoing.
- 900.18 Surface Water Salkeld Road Opposite Hopes Garage. —

 Confirmed that the water was flowing onto the road from a blocked drain in roadside field.

Action:- Agreed to discuss with the landowner concerned.

- **900.19 Penrith Masterplan** It was reported that the Parish Council had responded to the 'Engagement' process by totally opposing the proposed scheme as being inappropriate for the future need of Penrith. A copy being on file.
- **900.20 Langwathby Recycling Facility –** Reported that an extra bin for tin cans was required.

Action:- To request an extra bin from EDC.

901 Correspondence

901.1 Tree Safety - Correspondence had been received from CALC recommending, for insurance purposes, that all trees in a Parish, which were the responsibility of the Parish Council, be inspected every two years for safety. It being noted that the majority of trees involved were to be found on Langwathby Village Green with a few behind the playground at Edenhall. **Action:-** Agreed to compile a register of trees in the Parish, which the Council were responsible for, and to seek a quotation for a survey to be undertaken. This to be submitted to a future meeting for consideration.

901.2 EDC Local Plan – It was reported that a training session was being held in Appleby Public Hall on Wednesday 28th November at 7pm.

902 Councillor Matters

902.1 Back Road, Langwathby - Blocked Drain.

Reported that a drain was blocked on the back road close to the BT exchange. **Action: - To** report to Highways.

902.2 A Parish Flag. It was reported that Langwathby School had shown an interested in designing a Parish Flag. A Councillor also suggested that the erection of a flag pole, on the village green, opposite the War Memorial, was something to be considered for a future meeting.

Action: - Cllr D Banks to discuss the matter further with Langwathby School and to report back to a later meeting.
