49/24 Hartside Community First Responders – Alison Smith, from the Hartside Community First Responders, gave a presentation on the role of 'First Responders' and their importance within the community, in respect of providing a service in the event of an emergency and also in respect of parishioner training in the use of defibrillators.

Defibrillators are a vital, lifesaving, piece of kit in the event of a medical emergency, particularly critical in a case of cardiac arrest, where every second counts.

To save a life, speed is essential and the importance of having personnel on hand who are trained in emergency first aid and in the use of a defibrillator cannot be over stressed.

It was mentioned that they, currently, have 11 active members but only one in Langwathby even though that is one of the busiest villages, locally. 56 /24 Highways and Land Matters

56.1 Eden Straights Traffic Incident –. Langwathby Speeding Concerns Response from Highways.

WAFC Highways Department are aware of the sad accident which took place in early June on Eden Straights and are concerned that the understanding is that the motorist was travelling at speed through the village. A couple of years ago we introduced a budget category which enables us to gather more data around the Locality Area of Eden, unfortunately some of the data we hold is old or no longer relevant due to the change in behaviors of motorists and changes to the Highway Code.

We have selected the Eden Straights Road as one of the locations which we would like to obtain more up to date data for this financial year, highlighting the volumes of traffic using the route and the average speed in which motorists were travelling.

Once we are in receipt of the information I will bring it to the attention of the Parish Council with the intention of identifying if there are areas of concern and how we may address them.

Traffic Management (Eden) & TTRO (Westmorland and Furness) Team Leader

56.2 Langwathby One Way One-Way Traffic Restriction

Further to the Parish Council asking, over three years ago, that two roads within the village were restricted to one-way traffic flow, Highways are aware that this restriction is something which requires a traffic regulation order change, which can often take up to 18 months to progress.

However, it is possible for Highways to consider this restriction under temporary powers, it could then be introduced, in the near future, for a duration of up to 18 months to enable it to be trialed and, subject to approval, be made permanent.

Action: - Councillors, unanimously agreed to the setting up of a temporary, one-way restriction for an 18-month period.

56.3 Cycling Improvements Langwathby Bridge

Highways have reported that the work to introduce the advanced stop line and road marking, to aid cyclists, is planned o take place on 31st July 2024 with the loops being cut for the traffic signals on the 1st August.

56.4 Maypole Gardens Speeding Concerns

In order to enable Highway to identify the speeds in which motorists are travelling through the estate they need to install 'tubes' to gather data before any action can be taken. A site visit will be made to the estate to determine the best location to record the traffic attending the children's nursery. Once data is collected an action plan will be compiled, if deemed necessary.

56.5 Back Lane Light Coxen Lane – Langwathby.

It was reported that Electricity Northwest Limited, have confirmed that works to illuminate this light are now booked for 12th August, including the necessary road closure.

58.7 Updated Westmorland & Furness Council Plan Delivery Framework

It was reported that the Delivery Framework is updated annually and sets out how WAFC will deliver the vision described in their Council Plan 2023-2028 for our area to become a 'great place to live, work and thrive'

58.8 WAFC Healthy Child Programme Consultation

It was reported that a consultation has been launched by Westmorland and Furness Council on a proposed redesign of their Healthy Child Programme services. The objective being to ensure that the Council is providing a consistent service across the whole council area and can meet the varying levels of need across the 0-19 age range.

58.9 Overgrown Foot path.

Concern had been raised that that the public footpath from the feed mill to Winskill via Briggle Beck was becoming almost impassible due to maturing cereal crops.

Action; - Agreed for the Council to look into the issue, bearing in mind we are living in a rural area and that the crops in question will be harvested in the near future. The land in question will have crops rotating on it and will probably be in grass next year.
